find as many World War II Veterans as possible so that they

can give them a bit of a cheer at this extraordinary time, remind them their service remains valued, and that they are not forgotten. Any Veteran of the Royal Navy, Army, Royal Air Force and Merchant Navy who served during WW2 (1939-1945) and who lives in the UK is eligible to receive the gift box known as the 'Forgot You Not Box.' This includes those who served in the Commonwealth Armed Forces in support of Britain's war effort and now live in the UK.

The aim is to bring the Veterans a bit of cheer and to thank them for all they gave. It will also be an appropriate way to acknowledge 100 years of support by The Not Forgotten to those who have suffered and served their nation.

To register for the gift the Veteran, or authorised member of their family or carer needs to send The Not Forgotten the following information:

 Full name (first name, surname & maiden name if appropriate), and Date of Birth

- Service number & Military details – Arm/Unit of service & dates if known
- Full postal address & telephone number






The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service

The Map of Need

The Northern Hub for Veterans and Families Research at Northumbria University used funding from Covenant Fund to develop a map of veterans' and their families' welfare needs across the whole of the UK, based on data from public sources, statistics, health data and data directly from Armed Forces charities.

We call this the Map of Need.

There are currently thought to be around 2.75 million veterans living in the UK. To date, there has been little understanding of veterans' specific regional needs, provision in those regions and numbers of veterans and their families needing access to this provision.

With the wellbeing of ex-Service personnel in the UK a national focus in recent years, the Map of Need provides an important Public Health Observation function with implications at a local, regional and national level.

It enables the comparison of multiple data sources and research findings, providing users with an accurate picture of our veteran population, now and in the years to come.

What does the Map of Need show us?

Through a series of reports, the Map of Need gives clearer insights into where veterans are within the UK, what their current needs are

and what their future needs might be, by looking at the support they have asked for or accessed.

One of the main goals of the Map of Need project is to provide evidence-based findings about the veteran population. Data sharing partnerships are central to the analysis within the project, giving the ability to statistically compare multiple data sources when examining a veteran or family issue, and then compare these with wider research findings. Strategic programme launched to address suicide risks among vulnerable veterans

The Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust has launched One is Too Many; a specialist, targeted programme. This programme will fund projects that address the difficulties experienced by vulnerable veterans in dealing with suicidal thoughts and feelings; but who are not successfully accessing the support that they need.

Targeting significant challenges

This programme will fund a small number of projects that will provide urgent support and coordinated assistance to veterans most at risk of suicide or self-harm to help them access the care that best meets their needs; targeted to veterans who are not engaged with services that can offer appropriate support. It can also fund projects that can demonstrate that they would hope to reduce suicide levels in the future through this funded work.

The needs that this programme is trying to address are complex, and grants of up to £300,000 are on offer. Projects that can show that

they are working with partners and that their proposed idea promotes a joined-up approach with care pathways and reduces duplication are more likely to be awarded a grant. Grants under this programme will be limited, and it is likely that only 3-5 projects will be funded.
